## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This is a 24 unit program that is intended to capacitate k-12 teachers to handle the new basic education curriculum.

## PROGRAM FEATURES

- Balances theoretical and pedagogical concerns of teachers to meet the demands of the Enhanced Basic Education Curriculum (K to 12).
- Anchors on Constructivist approach. Collaborative Intergrative Active Learning. Problem- based Learning
- Offers courses that are content intensive, PCK grounded, Outcomes-based, Inquiry-oriented, and technology based.

## WHO CAN APPLY?

Teachers and other professionals who:

- Teach subjects which are not their subject area specialization.
- Teachers who do not have baccalaureate degree in education.
- Teachers who need retooling given the integrated/ experiential approach to teaching in the K to 12 curriculum.

## GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Letter of Application addressed to the Director of Admissions and complete application form for admission.
- Certificate of employment/ work experience (if applicable).
- A copy of the applicant's curriculum vitae with two (2) copies color picture.
- Recommendation letter from employer/superior/ former professor.
- Transcript of Records.

Note: Faculty/Institute offering the program has specific admission requirements in addition to the general admission requirement

## APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. Present letter of application to the Associate Dean/Institute Director of the Faculty/Institute that is offering the program of choice.
2. Submit the approved letter of application and the other general admission requirements to the Office of Admissions.
3. Proceed to MIS for Online Profiling.
4. Get order of payment form from the Office of Admissions;
5. Pay Php 250.00 processing fee at the Cashier's Office.
6. Go back to Office of Admissions for registration.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Transcript of Records (TOR) of Bachelor's Degree (Original and Certified True Copy) with General Point Average (GPA) 85%/2.0/ B or better.
- Two copies of 2x2 recent colored picture
- Certificate of GPA/GWA of Bachelor's Degree from their Registrar
- Entrance examination fee to be paid to the University Cashier
- Recommendations from 3 former mentors/employers

## STEPS IN APPLYING FOR THE GRADUATE COLLEGE ADMISSION TEST

- 1 Log on to [www.pnu.edu.ph](http://www.pnu.edu.ph) Click on PWEBBS portal.
- 2 Register online and fill out the GCAT application form.
- 3 Print the accomplished GCAT application form.
- 4 Present the requirements to the Office of Admissions together with the printed application form for evaluation.
- 5 Get the order of payment from the Office of Admissions and pay the entrance examination fee at the University cashier's office.
- 6 Get the test permit from the Office of Admissions.
- 7 Take the Graduate College Admission Test on schedule date.
- 8 Log-on to PNU website for results.
- 9 If passed proceed to the Program Coordinator/ Associate Dean/ Director of Institute for interview on a specified date.
- 10 Enroll on scheduled date.

## REQUIREMENTS FOR ENROLLMENT

- Original Transcript of Records (TOR) of Bachelor's Degree. Remarks on the TOR should be either "Granted Honorable Dismissal" or "Copy for PNU".
- Original NSO Marriage Certificate if TOR bears maiden name.

## GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

1. Complete admission requirements is a pre-requisite before one is given permission to take the GCAT.
2. Applicants are required to have undergraduate degrees in the same discipline or specialization they are applying for, except for master's programs that do not have equivalent undergraduate degrees (e.g. Educational Management).
3. Those with undergraduate degrees different or unrelated to the master's degree they are applying for may be admitted subject to requirements for transition scheme.

## PHILIPPINE NORMAL UNIVERSITY

THE PHRASE "normal school" is traceable to the French "*école normale*", the institution for higher learning in France in the 18th century.

The present Philippine Normal University was originally the Philippine Normal School (PNS), the first institution of higher learning established during the American occupation of the Philippines. Created by Act No. 74 of the Philippine Commission, it gave Filipinos training in the science of teaching. The PNS formally opened on September 1, 1901, with Mr. Elmer B. Bryan as its first superintendent. Seven other Americans succeeded him before the designation of Mr. Manuel Escarilla as the first Filipino superintendent in 1939.

With the signing of the charter, Republic Act No. 416 on June 18, 1949 during the term of President Elpidio Quirino, PNS was converted into the

Philippine Normal College, authorized to grant undergraduate and graduate degrees in education. Republic Act 6515 mandated the offering of doctorate and other academic programs relevant to the training of teachers. On December 6, 1991, the Philippine Normal College was converted into the Philippine Normal University. Finally, on January 12, 1992, it was elevated into a full-fledged university by President Corason C. Aquino.

In recognition of its continued leadership in teacher education, PNU was designated as the National Center for Teacher Education by virtue of R.A. 9647 on June 30, 2009.

The main campus of the University is in the City of Manila with branches in Prosperidad, Agusan del Sur; Alicia, Isabela; Cadiz City, Negros Occidental; and Lopez, Quezon.

As the established producer of knowledge workers in the field of education, it shall be the primary source of high quality teachers and education managers that can directly inspire and shape the quality of Filipino students and graduates in the country and the world.
